

Publication Opportunity

Writers who meet deadlines, follow submission guidelines, and submit to the editing process will be chosen for inclusion in a book titled, . . . *El ro'I: The God Who Sees*, published by Living Parables, an imprint of EABooks Publishing, making them “published” authors. Authors can purchase books at a reduced rate and keep the profit from their sales.

Guidelines

- For unpublished authors (can have articles, blogs, or online content published either paid or unpaid, but not a book for which royalties were paid)
- Only those who follow the full submission guidelines will be considered.
 - One submission per person registered for the conference.
 - Submit a short story, article, devotional, poem, or prayer.
 - 1500-word limit for a single story, devo, poem, or prayer (not multiple submissions).
 - Include a 50-word bio at the end of your submission written in 3rd person, a title to your piece, and your name with contact information (email, address, and phone number) at the top of the first page of the submission (none of this is included in submission word count total).
 - Standard manuscript format (Times New Roman, 12pt font, double spaced, 1-inch margins, Microsoft Word doc or docx).
 - The submission should tie into the theme of the book.

- Those that best reflect the theme, meet submission guidelines, and represent the best writing of a new author will be chosen for inclusion in the book.
